



## **How would you like to be 30 forever?**

Too late? No, not really. At the very heart of the Christian faith is our belief in the resurrection of Jesus. The Bible tells us we'll one day be resurrected just like him! In 1 Corinthians 15, the Apostle Paul writes, *"If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is useless and you are still guilty of your sins. If our hope in Christ is only for this life, we are more to be pitied than anyone in the world. But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead. And all who belong to Christ will be raised when he comes back. What kind of bodies will they have? Our earthly bodies are planted in the ground when we die, but they will be raised to live forever. Our bodies are buried in brokenness, but they will be raised in glory. They are buried in weakness, but they will be raised in strength. It will happen in a moment, in the blink of an eye, when the last trumpet is blown. Our dying bodies must be transformed into bodies that will never die."* So let's think about this...

Will someone who dies at 100 with a body that's wasted away live that way for eternity? Will someone who dies at the tender age of 3 live with a 3-year-old body for eternity? Will someone who has lost a leg to diabetes live that way for eternity? Of course not! Scientists tell us that our bodies continue to mature until the age of 30; then they begin to deteriorate. Can I get a witness? I personally believe that we will be raised from the dead with resurrection bodies that are fully mature the way God intended them to be without deterioration, disease or disfigurement! I believe that I will live in that 30-year-old body for eternity with God and the ones I love! I

believe that I will be reunited with the four children I lost after conception through miscarriage! I believe I will be reunited with my parents as they were in the prime of their lives!

This hope of the resurrection is what Easter Sunday is all about! Jesus has triumphed over death and the grave. Jesus holds the keys to death and Hell! (Revelation 1:18) *“I know that my Redeemer lives, and he will stand upon the earth at last. And after my body has decayed, yet in my body I will see God! I will see him for myself. # **SPRING CLEANING SAFETY**

With winter releasing its grip and finally turning to spring, many of us will open our doors and windows and shake the dust from our homes. When engaging in “spring cleaning”, it is important to do so safely. It is also important to remember there are other areas besides just the baseboards and under the couch that can contribute to a safer and healthier home.

- A clean air system is vital to home health. Remember to change air filters and vacuum accessible air ducts and vents.
- This is especially important with humidifiers and dehumidifiers, which are ripe for mold issues.
- Check your medicine cabinet and discard expired or unknown medication. Be sure to always secure medication in a high and/or locked space to keep them away from children.


- Check your garage or other storage areas for potentially toxic or flammable wastes---things like old paint, solvents and pesticides.
- Eliminating these can not only clear up space but avoid fire issues and keep them away from kids. Call your local sanitation department for the best ways to get rid of household hazardous materials.
- Remember to change the batteries in all smoke detectors.
- This is also a great opportunity to update your Emergency Contact Phone Numbers.
- Review home safety plans such as where your family will meet if there is a fire and what to do if there is severe weather.

### Safety Reminders

- Use a two strap dust mask when cleaning out dusty areas, especially if you have allergies.
- Use proper lifting techniques when moving heavy objects, such as furniture. Ask for help if you need it!
- Do not step on the top step of a ladder when painting or cleaning out gutters.
- Wear rubber gloves when working with harsh cleaning solvents to protect your hands.
- Keep children away from heavy machinery, especially lawn care equipment
- Always wear eye and ear protection when using machines like lawn mowers and weed eaters.

## SMALL WORLD UPDATES:





We were pleased that Geri is continuing to make progress, and that Wayne Abbott seems to be on the mend. We are also pleased that we received a generous donation of a refrigerator from RTI through the efforts of Mike Schwarze. Thanks also to Jimmy Layman and Mike Dubé for picking it up and moving it into our pantry. We are aware that we have a bit of work to do to complete the pantry, and we hope to complete the project this year. Because of a recent treatment Susan was unable to attend this meeting, and vice president Florine Layman led the meeting.

Our Easter program entitled “The Empty Egg” was presented by Emily and Margaret, with all members joining in the closing unison prayer. Charlotte shared some of the missions that were highlighted in the *Prayer Calendar* for March:

- A camp for disabled children in Arkansas
- A program to train women to be tailors in The Sudan
- Helping a small town in Kentucky obtain clean water
- A village in the Congo where a UMW skills workshop helped woman develop sewing and knitting skills

Natalie brought a *Response* moment about “Second Chances”. **FROM FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY:** Marybeth Thielke posted her story on our Facebook page. Be encouraged!

My husband and I married young in 2008. A week later, we became youth pastors and soon became pregnant with our first child. We made some bad financial decisions that year. An older friend promised us some of his inheritance money, and the idea of becoming wealthy quickly turned our hearts from what God had called us to. We sold the car we'd received from our church, got a loan on a new car, and told our employer we were "praying" about leaving.

Late September 2009, I was about a week away from having the baby. We were at the hospital visiting the friend who had promised us the money, which he still hadn't received. My husband suddenly left the room. I didn't think anything of it, until he didn't come back. I said my goodbyes and found him in the waiting room. He said he had become lightheaded after seeing the drainage tube on our friend's neck. As he walked down the hallway, he lost vision in both eyes.

My husband is definitely the Nerd, and he was very good about planning and not being loose with money. Through tears I explained that I'd rather spend a million dollars to find out he's okay

than to not go in and have something be terribly wrong just because we didn't want to waste the money. He finally agreed to go to the emergency room.

When the doctor said, "There's a two-centimeter mass in his brain," my husband was speechless. I just kissed his face, crying, and kept repeating, "Oh honey, I love you, oh honey ..." When the doctor handed me the discharge sheet with the words "brain tumor" on the top, I was sick to my stomach.

On October 3, Trevor underwent a six-hour surgery to remove the tumor, which we later found out was actually touching the brain stem. Our surgeon was confident he removed every trace. We clung to each other and Jesus through it all. There was no other option. We were terrified and needed a rock. I opted to have a C-section one day before my due date so Trevor could be there for the birth of his son. We were patients at the same time and were actually discharged on the same day.

After leaving the hospital, we grieved over the fact that we'd lost sight of our love for the Lord. We were reeling with a newborn and bills pouring in. We didn't even open them. Pile after pile sat on our kitchen table. We had been denied the

possibility of staying on as youth pastors. We were looking for a house and health insurance, and we had signed up for government aid. We were both jobless for three months after surgery ... at the very bottom.

That's when a friend from another church called one night and offered to pay our way through a class called Financial Peace University. I had never heard of it, but I knew this was what God wanted us to do. The class not only brought us hope, but also tools to help us start over, a community of believers who encouraged us, and a trust in God to get out from under debt.

We had over \$40,000 in debt and over 20 individual payments to make. Two years later, on one income, with two babies and one on the way, we paid off all of our debt but the very last one. Over the course of two years, we've paid off \$27,000 of debt on a gross income of \$20,000 each year. With our very last debt in deferment and the possibility of using all those monthly payments towards it, we should be debt-free this time next year.

What else can we say other than God is so good?

## Great Preachers From The Past.....

### Dr. B. R. Lakin



I first heard of Dr. B. R. Lakin from a preacher friend I was preaching for in South Kentucky. He insisted that we hurry to his home after the morning service so we could hear Dr. Lakin's Sunday sermon on radio. (That was before the days of television).

When we reached the pastor's home, he turned on the radio, and we listened in silence while Dr. Lakin preached. When he finished preaching, I remember saying, "That is the greatest preacher I have ever heard preach."

A short time later I went to Indianapolis to hear Dr. Lakin preach on the early morning broadcast called, *The Nation's Family Prayer Period*. I was fascinated by the professional way the broadcast was conducted. Mrs. E. Howard Cadle sang the opening theme, "Ere you left your room this morning, did you think to pray?" Then

Buford, the Cadle's son, stepped to the microphone, greeted the audience, and announced the song his mother was going to sing. When her song ended, Buford said, "And now, ladies and gentlemen, here is your friend and mine, Dr. B. R. Lakin." He stepped aside and Dr. Lakin stepped to the microphone, confident, relaxed, and professional. In about eight minutes he greeted the audience and preached as only he could preach on radio.

After that I saw Dr. Lakin often and we became good friends. I probably came to know him better than any other preacher. He preached for me at least twice in what he called his "One Night Revivals." On both occasions we had great crowds and blessed results. He had me to fly my plane that was equipped with a powerful loud speaker to Indianapolis and announce that he was going to preach in an open air service. In 1952 Dr. Lakin resigned as pastor of Cadle Tabernacle to go into full-time evangelism. He also gave up his daily ministry on *The Nation's Family Prayer Period* which was aired nationwide from the tabernacle. I had him for his first revival after he left the tabernacle. After that I had him hold several meetings in churches I pastored. I arranged a county-wide meeting for him at the fairgrounds in Harrodsburg, Kentucky. I had him in a large tent revival in Lexington, and he had me to come to Dayton, Ohio and preach in a tent revival he was holding there.

I persuaded Dr. Lakin to put some of his sermons on long-play albums and produced several of them. I also reprinted some of the books he had written.

In 1954 I took Dr. Lakin on his first trip to the Holy Land. We roomed together on the month-long tour of fifteen countries. I had never been with Dr. Lakin for an extended period before that, and I thought that in three or four days he would run out of anything humorous to say. I was mistaken. He never repeated himself during the month we were together, and at the end of the month, he was as fresh as he had been in the beginning. His humor was natural. It flowed like an ever-flowing stream.

Dr. B. R. Lakin was born in Wayne County, West Virginia, June 5, 1901. He went to be with the Lord, March 15, 1984. The house where he was born, near where Big Hurricane Creek joins the Big Sandy River, still stands.
