"Wash and Wait"

A Meditation on Mark 1:1-8 by Pastor Adam

The beginning of Mark's gospel immediately introduces John the Baptist, who is preaching a message of baptism and repentance in the wilderness, and then says to prepare for the One who is coming. In a phrase, "wash and wait."

John is by all appearances strange. He wore wild camel hair. He ate wild honey and locusts. It's as if there were an unkempt, homeless man living down by Parkwood Lake, who notoriously eats a diet of worms and wildlife. Every day he stands on the shoreline and yells at people. Parents don't want their kids getting too close to "Crazy Jonathan," as they call him. Curious people drive by in their cars to get a good look at him. No one wants to come too close.

But, what if we chose, for a little while, to leave the comfort and security of our homes to go to Parkwood Lake and listen to him? What would he say to us? I imagine it would be something like this: "This story that I'm talking about is not about me; it's about God. And, the kind of baptism I offer at Parkwood Lake is as if you were to walk up to the water's edge to see your reflection, but instead of peering *at* yourself, you peer *in*." John tells us, if we are willing to receive this baptism, we will take a long, hard look inward, which means we will see ourselves for *who we really are* – the good, the bad, and the ugly. This is not self-torture. This is self-examination.

I know a therapist who will often begin a session with a new client this way: "where does the story begin?" For him, the hope of asking such a question is that this person might come to tell a truthful story about themselves without resorting to blaming, resentment, or bitterness. I imagine "Crazy Jonathan" asking a similar question, "where does the story begin *for you*?" Where the good news meets us is when we can finally tell a true story about ourselves in a way that 1) the painful parts of our past no longer have a hold on us, and 2) we can look back at our lives and see how God has been weaving his story in with our story all along.

And once we've finished telling our story to Crazy Jonathan, John isn't finished with us. He's pointing us towards something in the distance – towards *Someone*. And he's telling us, "I'm really glad you've come, I'm glad you've told me your story, and I honestly believe you. But, look: this story isn't about you, anymore; it's about God. And He's coming. Just you wash and wait."
